



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## Introduction

- (4) Domestic Legal System and Fundamental Rights.
- (5) State Responsibilities and Obligations relating to Human Rights: International and Regional Levels.
- (6) Violations of Human Rights and/or Fundamental Rights, and Domestic & International Remedial Measures/ Mechanisms.
- (7) Law Enforcement and Human Rights: Protection and Promotion of Human Rights
- (8) Evolving New Types of Rights: individual & grouprights: women, children, minority, refugee, IDPs etc.
- (9) Contemporary Challenges of Human Rights: Domestic and International Challenges.
- (10) Elective Seminars on Special Topics.
